

## Core brief

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### Key highlights December

**50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations:** The anniversary provides an opportunity for us to reflect and celebrate our achievements over the last fifty years. It also allows us to enhance our reputation by providing a way for us to set out our vision for the University for the next 50 years.

There will be a series of activities throughout the year here and worldwide, each designed purposefully to target specific stakeholders and with clear calls to action such as encouraging businesses to engage with the industry collaboration zones and to provide internships, for example. There will be a dedicated anniversary website which will feature “365 days of Salford”. This will be updated daily and will share a day in the life of staff and students throughout the anniversary year.

A distinctive 50<sup>th</sup> version of our brand will be used throughout the year. A brand toolkit will be available from Marketing and External Relations.

**THE Awards Success:** Last week, we collected Research Project of the Year at the THE Awards in London. Dr Mike Wood from the School of Environment & Life Sciences won the award for his work around the Chernobyl disaster. His research hugely increased understanding of how nuclear radiation affects animal life and used a ground-breaking technique to provide new evidence about what happens to the diversity and abundance of large and medium-sized mammals after radiation exposure.

He worked with Honorary Prof Nick Beresford from the [NERC Centre for Ecology & Hydrology](#) and Ukraine’s [Chornobyl Center](#) on the international collaboration project. Together they used the area around the Chernobyl accident site as a laboratory to study the continuing effect of the disaster on wildlife. **Christmas Closure:** The University, including MediaCityUK, will close for Christmas at 3pm on Friday 23 December and will reopen after the New Year on Tuesday 3 January.

All colleagues are asked to leave by 3pm on Friday 23 December, which will be a normal working day. This will allow the buildings to be secured by the Security Team. Please note that once the building has been locked, no-one will be allowed back in.
